Colleges and universities are in the business of providing students with the support they need to succeed. Knowing about and using such resources are up to the student.


Dr. John Downey, dean of students at Queens University of Charlotte, is a resident in the Ballantyne community. "My No. 1 piece of advice is to remember you have prepared your child for this moment," says Downey, the dean at Queens. Going away to college is the symbolic moment for growing up.

Camille Davidson knows that she and her husband have been working toward this for their son's entire life. "I have to step back and say, 'We have prepared you for this. You know who you are,'" she says. "I have taught him to make good choices. We have given him the foundation. As a mom, I just have to remind myself over and over." (b)

Rooftop Repose

Brazwells Serves Up Sunset Views, Eclectic Menu

hen you time it just right and settle into a seat on the rooftop patio at Brazwells Premium Pub, you can catch one of the season's prettiest sights: the sun setting each evening between the city's buildings.

Brazwells is a unique place. It's the only sports bar in Ballantyne with its own urban-style rooftop, in addition to a lively dining room and relaxing patio. It captures many different moods — mellow and serene as friends



gather at the end of a workday, but also energetic and fun when fans meet to cheer on their favorite teams. It's a popular spot for business meetings and networking over happy-hour libations, and it draws families with kids who play lively games of Jenga while their parents sip sangria.

Versatile Kitchen

The menu is eclectic. The Holy Cow Burger nearly defies gravity as it towers over hand-cut fries on the plate. It consists of two eight-ounce patties, stacked with provolone and cheddar cheeses, tomato, bacon, peppers, onion rings and condiments that include house-made bacon jam. A helpful knife inserted vertically holds the burger together on its trip from the kitchen to the table. Among other beef selections, rib-eye steak makes for an extra-tender steak teriyaki with jasmine rice.

Sesame tuna is seared and glazed to perfection, then sliced and artfully arranged with bright green broccolini. Seasonal salads are abundant, and the kitchen is happy to accommodate

requests for vegetarian, vegan or gluten-free dishes.

Warm weather calls for cool cocktails, such as a Ballantyne Mule made with grapefruit vodka, lime juice and ginger beer. At brunch on Saturday and Sunday, it's hard to resist \$2 mimosas and the expansive build-your-own bloody mary bar; you can even order a "slider" sandwich as a garnish. In addition to a good list of wines and beers, Brazwells offers a nice selection of red, white and sparkling wines.

Brazwells is part of the Bottle Cap Group. The Ballantyne location is one of four that include Montford Drive in Charlotte, downtown Greenville, South Carolina, and Lake Norman, north of Charlotte, due to open soon. Chef Matt Bauwin oversees menu development at all four.

Weekend Tunes

Local musician Rod Fiske entertains on Friday evenings in Ballantyne, and a late-night DJ kicks things up a notch on Saturdays. A dozen chairs cluster around a central "Friendship Table" for solo diners or for those who want to strike up conversations. Don't be alarmed at the table cards promoting Sunday "SIN Nights"; that's an acronym for nights set aside for people in the restaurant service industry to unwind together.

Guests can make reservations for the main dining room and patio, but the rooftop is first come, first served. Some office workers in the area have been known to leave their desks a bit early when the weather is nice to head over to Brazwells. They want to make sure that they've got something refreshing in a glass and something tasty on the table as they watch the day end and a beautiful Ballantyne evening begin.



ORGANIZING Snafus Spur Ballantyne Residents to Offer SignUpGenius

t all started because of a series of snack snafus on the soccer field and at church.

Dan Rutledge was coaching his kids' soccer team and trying to get a snack assignment list organized. "I did it in Microsoft Word and had people sign up on a paper print out of it," he recalls. "Some moms were switching, and a few times no one remembered ... I had stuck the list in my soccer bag ... and I didn't know where it went." It all started because of a series of snack snafus on the soccer field and at church. Dan Rutledge was coaching his kids' soccer team and trying to get a snack assignment list organized.



Angel and Dan Rutledge run the Ballantynebased business, SignUpGenius. Dan, who moved to Ballantyne with his wife, Angel, in 2005, says, "There were multiple weeks the kids had no snacks and would look across the field and see the other team enjoying brownies."

Angel remembers a church Sunday School party around the same time where they split the class by the alphabet and messed that up, too. "We got to the party and everyone had brought two liters of Diet Coke and chips and salsa. And that's it," she says.

That got both of them thinking there had to be a better way.

Employees at SignUpGenius not only run the web-based business they enjoy outings together.



"We saw the need — we experienced the problem enough that we were motivated to do something, and Dan had the ability to do it," Angel says.

At the time Dan was working with Michael Vadini at a technology services company, and the two were looking for new projects. "I worked for 10 years developing products for other people and thought this could be automated in a way that could remind people and allow people to have one spot they could go to," Dan says.

Founded in 2008

Together, the men founded SignUpGenius in 2008. It's a website that literally helps people get organized. You create an online sign-up sheet, invite people and they sign up. SignUpGenius then sends reminders. "We replace the paper sign-up sheet that you would pass around or the 'reply all' email you would send to organize the group," Dan explains. The company started small. Dan and a part-time assistant managed the entire site until 2011 when Angel officially came on staff to help run things.

"I released the first version to family and friends and, of course, my soccer team and said, "Try this out," Dan remembers. People liked it, and it started spreading. Someone on the soccer team would send it to someone at school. Then someone there would send it to a nonprofit, and it started gradually moving out. "Pretty soon," Dan says, "I had someone emailing me from Texas saying they wanted it for their swim team."

Dan, now CEO, co-owns the firm with Vadini. Angel is the chief operating officer and chief marketing officer. The firm has grown so fast it keeps relocating to new offices within the Ballantyne area, not far from the Rutledges' home. The company has been in Ballantyne Corporate Park since 2015.

SignUpGenius was named Small Tech Company of the Year at the NC Tech Awards in November.

Adopting from Liberia



"We basically decided we would adopt from Liberia, too, because we wanted to expand our family through adoption, and we knew our kids would have people with similar backgrounds to them here in our community," Angel explains.

As their family grew, so did SignUpGenius. The company now averages eight to 12 million users per month and had a whopping 66 million users in 2016. The Rutledges also now have 27 employees in their Ballantyne offices.

They love being in Ballantyne Corporate Park, even incorporating their "neighborhood" into the company's fun. They recently did a scavenger hunt around the office buildings and took the whole crew to see the Star Wars movie at StoneCrest. SignUpGenius was named Small Tech Company of the Year at the NC Tech Awards in November, and it just continues to grow.

"People ask me if I thought it was going to get big when I started? Yes, of course!" Dan says. "The reason you start it is because you think it's going to get big. But it was a process of watching more and more people find us and getting excited when we had 10,000 in a day on the site and then we had 100,000 ... then last year we had a million on the site in one day!"

But both Dan and Angel say the true measure of their business is the way SignUpGenius is helping people change the world for the better.

"I've been taking mission teams over to Liberia, and every time we go, we use the site to collect things for the kids: clothing, toothbrushes, soaps," Angel says. "We tend to take more than 30 suitcases full of items all donated by people who sign up, thanks to the site. That's been our mission (with the company) from the beginning — to empower people to change the world by making it simple to organize groups." ^(IIII)



of shells dislodged by storms from the floor of the gulf. The beachcomber's paradise gives rise to the "Sanibel Stoop" or "Captiva Crouch," the posture of visitors trolling the shoreline for conches, lightning whelks, colorful coquinas and brownspeckled junonia, a prized find.

Chris Stasinopoulos, a Ballantyne resident who visited Sanibel in December, says shelling was a high-

light of the trip. "We did island cow shelling by the lighthouse," he says of seeking cowrie shells. "The Holiday Inn on the beach where we stayed was very clean and nice."

Christy Benoliet has visited Sanibel many times. "My favorite thing is to see the manatee at the marina in South Seas Plantation Resort on Captiva or to go shelling on Sanibel," says the Ballantyne resident. Other diversions include the Sanibel Historical Village and Museum and J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge, a top birding spot in the nation, where tours via foot, car or canoe are available.

Local ambiance ranges from relaxing al fresco dining to spring training with the Boston Red Sox to colorful shops for exploration.

This area has something for everyone and offers a sanctuary from everyday cares.



Offshore and deep-sea sport fishing are another big lure on Sanibel and Captiva, where teal blue waters near the shore feature tarpon, snapper, snook, redfish and Florida pompano, while the ocean beyond is prime grouper territory. A dozen artificial reefs and wrecks around the barrier islands provide intrigue for scuba divers.

Kicking Back

Although best known for shelling, Sanibel and Captiva also appeal to visitors for their laid-back lifestyle reminiscent of vintage Florida. Only one two-lane road runs through Sanibel, and it has no stoplights. Dotting the route are small shopping complexes, casual restaurants and mom-and-pop motels and





resorts. Once over the short bridge to Captiva, a quiet road winds along million-dollar properties, ending at a charming village of eateries and shops bounded by unspoiled beaches.

Benoliet recommends staying at the Sundial Beach Resort & Spa or South Seas Plantation Resort. Other top choices are Casa Ybel Resort, Tween Waters Inn and Sanibel Harbour Marriott Resort and Spa. Foodie favorites include Sweet Melissa's Cafe, The Mad Hatter, The Mucky Duck, Captiva Island Inn and the funky Bubble Room Restaurant, known for scrumptious desserts like Key lime pie.

Fort Myers

As a gateway to Sanibel, Captiva and other remote islands of southwest Florida, Fort Myers also attracts Ballantyne residents. Norm and Lee Schmidt spent several weeks there last fall and returned in January for another five weeks. "The Hampton Inn on Colonial Boulevard was superb," Lee reports. "We like the native pink shrimp at Pinchers, a seafood restaurant in the historic district, and Ford's Garage, also in that area."

While there, the Schmidts enjoyed Fort Myers Beach and touring the Edison & Ford Winter Estates. The site features an old-style riverfront home on 14 acres, laboratory and experimental botanical gardens maintained as a tribute to one of the world's inventive geniuses. A top selfie spot is a banyan tree given to Thomas Edison by Henry Ford in 1925 and now one of the largest of its species in the world. Next door sits "Man-

goes," the winter retreat of

automotive magnate Ford, who bought it in 1916 while visiting his friend Edison. Jen Lochte visits Fort Myers every summer. "We love it because the water is incred-

ibly crystal clear and the kids like to find sand dollars and

starfish --- which you must

put back in the water," says

the Ballantyne resident. "The downtown boardwalk area is

fun for the kids to walk around

and has great restaurants. Dur-

ing summer, though, I would

recommend staying along the

water to catch the breeze."

Spring Training

Fort Myers is a major spring training destination for fans of the Boston Red Sox and Minnesota Twins. JetBlue Park at Fenway South has replicated the manual scoreboard and "Green Monster," the high left field wall of Boston's Fenway Park. The picturesque Hammond Stadium, where the Twins hold preseason games, is modeled after Churchill Downs, with statuesque Royal Palms lining the entrance that leads to a waterfall fountain plaza.

No matter the season, though, Ballantyne residents agree that the southwest shores of Florida are a delightful destination, offering a sanctuary from everyday cares. (D)

Electric Ride

Adaptive, Motorized Bikes Increase Access to Cycling

otorists commuting from Ballantyne to Uptown might notice Francisco Montero, 51, making the commute — on his bike. Mind you, it's not any normal street bike. Montero rides a Felt BruHaul Cargo E-bike, or electric bike.

"It's super stable and safe, and the frontwind fairing keeps me warm and dry when it rains," Montero says.

As long as it's 25 degrees or warmer outside, Montero — a master bicycle technician, fitter and coach who has worked at area bike shops and is co-owner of Charlotte Cycles in Midtown — bikes the 15 miles from his home near Kingsley View to Bike Gallery on Park Road, where he currently lends his skills.

Montero says he has committed himself to making the approximately 40-minute ride as many days a week as possible and has already commuted 200 miles on his bike since purchasing it in October 2016 — even hauling his 6-foot Christmas tree home on it.

In "turbo" speed, Montero's bike can go as fast as 28 mph, and he occupies the traffic lane on the road. He says he hasn't had any issues with traffic or motorists.

With the electric assist, you don't feel the hills, he says. "Once you get used to it, you're flying."

Montero's bike has a Bosch 350-watt electric pedal assist motor that can run up to 60 miles on one charge. He says most commuters take their e-bikes on rides up to 10 miles each way.

Easy Cycling

Photo courtesy of Nancy from Sun City With specialty pedals, arm controls, seat backs and other modifications, e-bikes help increase riders' stability and safety while removing limitations. Therefore, they appeal not only to commuters but also to seniors and anyone rehabilitating an injury or wanting to travel farther with less effort.


Cruisin' in Sun City

Nancy from Sun City (she prefers going by her first name only) rides her Day 6 Patriot 750 Crank Forward bike back and forth from her home to the clubhouse. She also takes it to the library, grocery store, doctor's office and drug store. In the first six months of owning the bike, she too has already logged 200 miles.

"It's been totally awesome because I have the help I need getting up the hills, but I still get the exercise," she says.

Nancy has arthritis and bursitis and broke her back last year. "I couldn't really ride leaning over. There was too much pressure on

> my shoulders," she says. Her new bike is upright with a 16-inch seat and a seat back. "The handlebars come up and are fully adjustable, so I don't have to bend over."

Local Nonprofit, Book

Special features like the ones on Nancy's bike can be expensive. One Ballantyne mom is helping to raise money so that children with special needs can obtain adaptive bikes, which can cost \$3,500.

Conni Branscom started the non-

profit Kyle's Korner when she saw the joy on the face of her son, Kyle, when he received his adaptive bike.

Kyle has Down Syndrome and a major heart condition. The family received his diagnoses before he was born, and his older sister wondered what he would and wouldn't be able to do with his limitations. The family's then-babysitter, Brooke Luckadoo Hicks, an Ardrey Kell High student at the time, wrote a story for her senior exit project to answer that question.

This December, Conni, an assistant in the exceptional children's program with Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools, adapted that story into an illustrated children's book printed by Warren Publishing. Proceeds from book sales help purchase adaptive bikes for children with special needs.

"The fun part for Kyle is seeing friends riding their bikes in the neighborhood or at the park and he can join them," Conni says. "Watching him ride with his siblings and other kids just proves he is more alike than different."

For the Fun of It

Montero says he commutes by bike to train and to prove it can be done, but there's one more motivation: "There's a smile on my face the whole way there," he says.

At the core of the electric and adaptive bike phenomenon is the sense of joy the bikes bring back to people's lives.

"It's fun again to ride a bicycle," Montero says. ©

Ballantyne Ball Aids Lily Pad



In our first Creative Spark — a collaboration with Matt Olin and the CreativeMornings/CLT team — Davis shares with us the joys and challenges of his creative process.

What was it like growing up as the "dreamer" in your family?

I think being the dreamer was a direct result of being the middle child. Thinking outside the box was a necessity early in life. Finding creative ways to stand out and express one's self is essential for everyone. The middle child learns to do it a little earlier than most.

What's been most challenging about creating your book, "A Life through Letters"?

Making sure that I captured the spirit in which my father wrote his original letters. That was ever present in my work. It was such an honor to posthumously co-write with my father, and I wanted to get it right.

How did you keep yourself motivated and accountable to see this project through?

I had worked on the project starting in early 2013. Then in January 2015 I simply decided that was the year I was publishing the book. I picked a date and would not let myself stop until it was completed. I would often think of the struggles my father had in his life due to his physical limitations. That always kept me motivated.


people to connect. We all have people in our lives with whom we should be in touch. A simple note or letter has such a tremendous impact on the human spirit. Emails can be deleted in a fraction of a second. As I say in the book, letters can last a lifetime — and sometimes beyond.

Where are favorite spots in Ballantyne to get inspired?

Rush espresso, hands down. I spent a tremendous amount of time there while working on the book. It is where I go to write, connect and create. Paul and Jenny have done an amazing job of creating a space that feels like a community.

Anything else to share?

I see letter writing as a way to preserve one's legacy. One of the very fortunate by-products of this project is that I now have a living, breathing tribute to my father and our entire family from which my two little boys can learn. I would encourage everyone to take the time to capture that same legacy and put their own stamp on it. ©
