# Neighbors Enjoy Making Friendships over a Meal

THEY ARE THE 21ST CENTURY'S VERSION OF THE NEIGHBORHOOD DINNER PARTY. Bringing together busy working men and women with empty nesters, young couples and singles alike - dinner clubs are uniting those with a passion for good food, good company and a sense of community.

Ballantyne-area residents Kacie Arandas and Kathy Ragland co-chair the Piper Glen Women's Club's Wine and Dine group. The dinner club meets monthly, and the social component is just as important as the food. "We have made some fantastic friends through this whole

endeavor," Arandas says.

The Wine and Dine group began three years ago and is for couples only. "We either like to cook, love good food or both — and we enjoy tasting new wines," Arandas notes.

### From Chefs to Homemade

Ragland and Arandas have put a contemporary twist on

a dinner club that began with an emphasis on decadent gourmet fare from well-known chefs. Today the group is all about offering up great-tasting meals that don't take much more than an hour to prepare. New recipes often come from the Internet, and organizers coordinate four-course meals paired with wines.

But no two dinner clubs

are exactly the same. For Sharon and Sam Campagna, everything down to the bread is preferred homemade. The couple started the Ardrey Commons Gourmet Club in September 2012. The club meets quarterly and is open to both couples and singles.

"Everything we do is made from scratch," Sharon explains. "That's part of what makes our dinner club unique."

And she jokes, "It's also why we only meet quarterly." A few of the more memorable dishes include steak tartare, coq au vin and escargot.

When Sam was in the Air Force, the couple was on the move every few years for roughly 20 years. At each new stop they would start a gourmet dinner club to bring people in their neighborhood together and to develop friendships.

"We talk about politics, religion, the homeowners association," quips Sam,

### Intimate Settings

Such intimate settings are essential for a successful dinner. Couples in the Piper Glen Wine and Dine group are divided among homes, with no more than four couples at a time where dinner is hosted. The menu is pre-set so that the same foods are served at each home. The hosting couple is in charge of preparing and cooking the entree, while the appetizer, salad and dessert are assigned to other couples.

"You really get to know people more intimately when dining with four couples per home as opposed to 40 or more people in one house," says Ragland. "We normally don't leave the dining room table for hours. Everybody really has a chance to get

a retired pilot. "Any topic is fair game at the dinner table. But we do keep it social and friendly."

Sharon says while members of the Ardrey Commons Gourmet Club are known to use good china, crystal and silver, the overall feel remains casual and relaxed. The group usually has 16 to 20 participants each quarter, and they are divided between two homes for dinner. While there is a theme for the evening, each host determines the menu.

to know each other." Sharing about travel, families, hobbies and more, club members often make long-lasting friendships.

Wine and Dine is open to anyone who is a member of the Piper Glen Women's Club. More than half of those who participate do not live in Piper Glen but reside in neighboring

communities. Couples pay \$40 a month to cover the cost of wine for the evening.

### **Global Cuisine**

Each year the Wine and Dine organizers select a new theme. Last year entrees featured cuisine from France, Italy and northern Africa. In 2014-15, "our theme is an American road trip," says Arandas. "We started off with a lowcountry boil from South Carolina, and we will end with a group pig roast in May."

### **SAVOR A PEAR** PROSECCO COCKTAIL

Founders of the Ardrey Commons Gourmet Club, the Campagnas always welcome guests with a specialty cocktail. They share the recipe for a pear prosecco cocktail, one of their favorites.

8 cardamom pods

½ cup water

½ cup sugar

1 cup pear nectar

1 teaspoon freshly squeezed lemon juice

1 750-milliliter bottle prosecco or cava, chilled

Place cardamom pods in a sealed bag. Crush the pods with a rolling pin or the bottom of a heavy pan until all pods are open and black seeds are crushed.

In a small saucepan over medium-high heat, bring crushed cardamom, water and sugar to boil. Once boiling, reduce the heat to low. Simmer for 8 to 10 minutes until it becomes a syrup that easily coats a spoon.

Return to medium-high heat and add the pear nectar to the syrup. Bring to a boil and remove from heat. Cover and let stand 30 minutes to infuse cardamom flavor.

Using a sieve, strain the pear juice into a small bowl or liquid measuring cup. Add lemon juice and refrigerate until cold, at least 30 minutes.

To serve, fill Champagne glasses with 4 tablespoons of syrup and top with prosecco.

get over a mid-afternoon slump, British researchers found that napping was more effective than caffeine or getting more sleep at night. A 30-minute nap can improve alertness and boost creativity. Naps appear to increase activity in the right side of the brain, the hemisphere responsible for processing images, emotion and intuition.

For the biggest benefits, nap between 1 p.m. and 4 p.m. (a later nap could interfere with nighttime sleep) and set an alarm to keep naps to 30 minutes or risk waking up groggy.

### One-Hour Options

Go to a yoga class: Poses like Downward Dog, Cobra and Warrior help improve flexibility, strength, balance and posture while reducing stress and promoting relaxation.

nonstick cooking spray 3 packets Knox unflavored gelatin 1/<sub>2</sub> + 1/<sub>4</sub> cup cold water 2 cups sugar

<sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup light corn syrup

1/4 teaspoon salt

2 teaspoons vanilla extract powdered sugar for dusting

- 1. Line a 9-by-13-inch pan with plastic wrap. Spray the wrap with cooking spray.
- Add <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup cold water to the bowl of an electric mixer.
   Sprinkle gelatin packets and let stand for 10 minutes.
- 3. Combine sugar, <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup water and corn syrup in a medium saucepan and bring to a boil. Boil for one minute, stirring constantly.
- 4. With mixer on medium speed, pour hot sugar slowly into gelatin.
- 5. Add salt and increase speed to high for 12 minutes.
- 6. Turn mixer to low and add vanilla.
- 7. Pour marshmallows into pan and cover with another layer of sprayed plastic wrap.
- 8. Let sit overnight.
- 9. Remove marshmallows from pan onto waxed or parchment paper. Slice into cubes and roll in powdered sugar.

## Neighborhood Fave

Blackthorne Rapidly Gains Loyal Following

TO START YOUR OWN RESTAURANT AND MAKE IT A SUCCESS, you've got to do three things: spend years learning the business, pick a high-traffic location and rely on experts to guide your decisions until you get on your feet.

Brothers Tim and Jay Duffy did none of those things. And yet their restaurant, Blackthorne Restaurant & Bar, has become a favorite dining destination in Ballantyne — one that appeals equally to customers who want to enjoy a casual cocktail and those seeking an inspired menu for a special occasion.

The Connecticut natives relocated to the growing Charlotte region, Jay in the late '90s and Tim in 2002, where their parents had put down roots a few years earlier. Both men were working in the paper and printing business when their talks about opening a restaurant of their own became serious. Their primary "research" was gustatory: "We ate in hundreds of good restaurants," Tim remembers.

### Opened in 2012

They roughed out a plan for a menu, looked at possible locations for their eatery and trusted their intuition to lead them in the right direction. In 2012, they opened in a cozy space tucked away on North Community House Road. And in that short time, Blackthorne has become a popular gathering spot for neighborhood regulars and the larger community alike.

Executive chef Mathew Bauwin works with the owners to offer a menu that evolves with the calendar of seasonal ingredients that can be sourced locally; though, many of the most well-liked dishes are available year-round.


The restaurant's pear pecan salad combines the sweetness of poached pears and candied pecans with the tartness of dried cranberries and the bite of blue cheese.

The iconic shrimp and grits dish native to the Carolina Lowcountry gets extra elegance with the addition of briny scallops that complement an earthy, house-made sausage.

### **Inviting Bar**

A restaurant's bar can feel like an afterthought, or just a "waiting room" for patrons until they're seated at tables, but the Duffys have made certain the bar at Blackthorne has its own identity. With seating for up to 50, it feels inviting. Local craft beers are on tap. Half-priced specials on Wednesdays from the solid wine list Jay Duffy developed make Blackthorne the ideal place for a mid-week respite.

Making a new space feel established is one of the biggest challenges a restaurant faces. With the same knack they bring to the food and libations at Blackthorne, the Duffys designed their rooms to feel timeless yet modern. They used rough-hewn woods throughout, accented with gleaming glass tile work. A garden they planted outside the kitchen door isn't mere whimsy; it provides herbs for the chefs and bartenders.

Once the new bridge opens on North Community House Road, many more residents will find themselves driving directly by Blackthorne Restaurant & Bar. When they stop in, they'll discover the welcoming flavors of their "new" favorite neighborhood gathering spot.

# Needs are Beyond Elementary

Endhaven Receives \$25,000

WHILE BALLANTYNE-AREA SCHOOLS ARE RECOGNIZED as some of the top performers within Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools, local elementary schools often need assistance to excel. Many of the 28277-based schools serve beyond their intended capacities and require additional resources to create optimal learning experiences.

The Bissell Cos. Inc., developer of Ballantyne Corporate Park, recently reached out to local elementary schools with an opportunity to receive a \$25,000 grant to fulfill school-specific needs. Bissell coordinated a selection committee to review applications and award the money as a holiday gift on behalf of tenants in Ballantyne Corporate Park.

Endhaven Elementary won the grant for updated playground equipment and to provide a safer environment for its students. The

school's critical need for grounds improvements to prevent additional injuries to children resonated with the selection committee.

With the gift, all dated and unsafe playground equipment at Endhaven will be removed and replaced with more current equipment. The funding will also enable the school to begin addressing drainage issues around its grounds, another area with unsafe conditions (due to erosion). A safe and appealing playground and surrounding grounds will not only benefit the students but local children for years to come.

"I believe that my most important job is to keep my students safe in a nurturing environment at school," says Brian Slattery, principal at Endhaven Elementary. "When we do this, we give students the best opportunity to be successful learners."

Slattery further supports the importance of playgrounds during the school day. "Research supports (that) healthy, active children learn better. Exercise promotes learning and developing the whole child."

Meanwhile, other school applications echoed the need to improve playgrounds, with unstructured playtime cited as "crucial" by the American Academy of Pediatrics. Elon Park Elementary requested enhancing its playground equipment to help meet growth challenges while creating a space to foster a healthy and neighborly international community.

Polo Ridge Elementary also needs a playground that can accommodate its growing student body while supporting its commitment to promoting healthy lifestyles. In addition, a sunshade for its outdoor classroom environment would significantly aid its science, technology, engineering and mathematics program.

Providence Spring's application focused on experiential learning. With an outdoor classroom to house year-round N.C. native plants, a miniature bird sanctuary and supporting educational materials, the school wants to take advantage of collaborative instruction while creating real-world experiences.

Hawk Ridge Elementary identified a need for a Learning Commons, an innovative space that encourages a high level of collaboration. Ballantyne Elementary's application spelled out a variety of needs — more access to current technology, curriculum-based literacy materials and a school garden, which could support its science program and grow food for the community.

These school needs are reminders for the community to be aware of public education challenges and informed about elective officials at all levels of government. The needs also provide a wealth of opportunities for other groups to step forward and help children of the community. As Slattery notes, "The quality of education will directly impact our community in the future."

# Keeping it Fresh 5 Great Ways to Advance Your Game this Winter

PUT THE BASEMENT TO GOOD USE THIS WINTER. Move the couch, lamp, dog, cat and anything else you care about out of the way to create room to work on your golf

game. If you want to hit the ball longer and straighter next spring, here are some ideas to keep fresh in your mind so that your game doesn't go cold.

### Molded Grip

Purchase a molded grip. It will guide where your hands should be on the club and help keep your hand placement consistent. A good molded grip also will align your hands so that the clubface is square.

### **Alignment Aids**

Jack Nicklaus mentioned several times that the set-up determines what motion a golfer makes. To help with your alignment, purchase some alignment rods from your local Home Depot or Lowe's. The home improvement stores call them driveway reflector rods. Using the station pictured, practice setting up properly. Ensure that your body is parallel to the target, your ball position is correct and the bottom groove of your golf club is perpendicular to the target.

### Putting Arcs

This is also a great time to work on your putting. There are several arcs available to help you groove a natural putting stroke. The three shown here are The Putting Arc, Inside

Down the Line and The EyeLine Golf Edge Putting Plane Rail (70-degrees). I prefer the plane rail because it teaches you to keep your stroke on plane and your clubface square to the plane. Before you know it, your stroke will be grooved and you'll be making more putts than ever before.

#### Mirror Practice

Using a mirror as feedback can help you see your desired positions throughout your swing. Use an expo marker or piece of tape to mark where the shaft plane is, and then mark the line where the shoulder plane is. Make sure to take your backswing and downswing somewhere between these two lines. If you do not have a mirror, you can use a glass door or window that will reflect at nighttime.

### Impact Bag Drills

Work on your impact position and understand how the clubface works through impact; this can help any golfer achieve the desired ball flight. To hit a draw, square the clubface to your intended start line and create a path that is more in to out (right of the start line) than the face.

If you are hitting the impact bag correctly, your arms and club shaft will form a lower case "y" as your weight shifts toward your front foot. The bag will also travel in the direction of your swing path. So if your club is traveling in to out, the bag will travel to the right of your target. However, the ball would have deflected in the direction the clubface was pointing and then curved right to left toward the flag.
